Health Learners explore how positive social interactions shape self- identity. They examine friendships, their qualities, roles, and responsibilities. They learn respectful communication for conflict resolution and reflect on changing friendships, developing strategies to maintain respectful relationships. Physical Education Learners develop water awareness and safety, refine basic swimming strokes, and practise safe procedures for entering and exiting the pool. They will also focus on developing movement skills and exploring different ways to move.
