Learners relate this to their local area, make observations and predict consequences of future occurrences and human activity. Learners will plan, conduct and report on an investigation of the erosion process. Learners apply science understandings to formulate control strategies in real-life situations.

This includes theme songs, sound effects and soundscapes that represent characters from television, film and media. Drama Learners explore traditional First Nations stories through process drama activities. In these lessons learners discover how the tradition of sharing stories involves important aspects of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islanders histories, cultures and knowledges.	Health Learners will identify strategies for maintaining health and fitness, explore the Australian Guide to Healthy Eating, and learn about the five food groups. They will understand the importance of a balanced diet and how health messages influence food choices, creating meal plans based on these messages. Physical Education Learners apply strategies for working cooperatively and apply rules fairly. They refine striking and fielding skills and concepts in active play and games. They apply skills, concepts and strategies to solve movement challenges in striking and fielding games.
