<p>Students engage with a variety of informative and imaginative texts that support learning across the curriculum. They read, view, and comprehend decodable texts, picture books, stories, and non-fiction.</p> <p>They explore familiar text types, identifying language and visual features, and recognize how words and images contribute to meaning. Through shared and independent writing, they create short texts using learnt vocabulary, basic punctuation, and phonics knowledge.</p> <p>For assessment students: Read, view, and comprehend a simple informative text. Create a short written informative text about a pet using words and images.</p>	<p>Students develop mathematical proficiency and confidence by:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Connecting number names, numerals, and quantities through subitising and counting strategies. Using physical and virtual materials to sort, quantify, partition, and solve everyday problems with numbers up to 10. Making and justifying mathematical decisions through quantification and direct comparisons of duration and events. 	<p>Our Living World</p> <p>Students observe the needs of living things and recognise the importance of scientific observation. They learn that survival depends on basic needs being met and explore how environments support living things. They consider the impact of human activity and natural events and discuss ways to protect living things in an environment.</p>

They develop the fundamental movement skills of running, jumping, hopping and galloping. They apply fundamental movement skills and solve movement challenges.</p>
