### Mathematics

Learners build confidence and positive attitudes towards mathematics as they:

- represent and work with numbers to at least 120
- model and solve addition, subtraction and sharing problems using materials and diagrams
- skip count by 2s, 5s and 10s
- recognise and create repeating patterns with numbers and objects.

# Science Exploring light and sound

In this unit learners explore sources of light and sound. Learners manipulate materials to observe how light and sound are produced, and how changes can be made to light and sound effects.

## **Humanities and Social Sciences (HASS)**

Learners explore familiar local places such as their school, park, or shops. They identify natural, managed, and constructed features and investigate how people, including Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples, describe weather and seasons. Learners explore pictorial maps and use location language to investigate places, ask questions, gather data, and reflect on ways to care for the environment.

# Health and Physical Education (Specialist Teacher)

In this unit, learners identify social changes that occur as they grow older and recognise ways they can take some responsibility for their own safety in different situations including road safety.

# **Physical Education**

In this unit, learners will perform fundamental movement skills of two-handed throwing and two-handed catching, soccer dribbling and basketball dribbling. They will test alternatives to solve large ball challenges and identify how the heart reacts to various physical activities.

### **Library (Specialist Teacher)**

Learners build language comprehension through shared and dialogic reading, exploring diverse texts across subjects. They develop a love of reading, fostering curiosity and enjoyment. A library bag is required for weekly borrowing.
