Music (Specialist teacher) Learners will develop the confidence to be creative, innovative, thoughtful, skilful, and informed musicians, building the knowledge and skills needed to listen with	Health In this unit, learners examine the purpose of advertising and the techniques used to engage children. They explore health messages seen in advertising and how they can be used to make good decisions about their own and others' health and wellbeing. Physical Education In this unit, learners will demonstrate fundamental movement skills (instep pass, punt kick and one hand strike) and test alternatives to solve movement challenges (to reach their targets).
